

## THE “CLASSIC” PERIOD 1978 and 1979

The first Collins was the “Quiltmaking” issue on March 8, 1978. Listed below are the 1978 and 1979 Collins FDCs by issue and Collins number for reference. They have become classic collectibles within the hobby..

### IMPORTANT

In addition to “01” covers, scarcer cancel varieties also exist on some early covers. Open-market prices on these covers have reached high levels and continue to advance. Scarce postmark varieties exist on many of the covers. If you decide to collect the 1978 and 1979 cachets, it is highly recommended that you refer to the illustrated catalog portion of his book Collins First Day Covers - The First Twenty Years - 1978 -1997 for precise cover variety identification. After Fred obtaining his Charleston cancels, he headed to the airport where he realized he had a little extra time and, on the spur of the moment, hand-addressed some envelopes to himself and mailed them. He repeated the process at the Pittsburgh, PA airport during his layover in route to his next stop, New York City, from which he mailed a final batch of covers. In total, he hand-addressed and mailed 80 covers during his inaugural first day cover trip as follows:

- o 7 from Charleston, WV (Collins #A103)
- o 23 from Pittsburg, PA (Collins #A104)
- o 37 from New York City, NY {Collins #A105}
- o 13 from New York City, NY- bullseye cancel {Collins #A106}

Those early hand-addressed covers did not see the light of day until they were rediscovered. These 80 Quiltmaking covers were actually sent through the mail-stream on the first day of issue which makes them very important to the overall story of Collins First Day Covers.
